

NATI WAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

The NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL is the joy and hope filled movement throughout our country to foster a greater understanding and appreciation of the gift of Eucharist, the source and summit of our faith. We are strengthened, healed, empowered, forgiven, challenged and nourished by this great gift. Many national and local events and activities are being planned to refresh, renew and strengthen our knowledge, appreciation and devotion to Eucharist throughout the upcoming year and beyond.

A National Eucharistic Pilgrimage will begin at four points across the U.S. on May 17th passing through cities, along highways and past rural towns journeying over 6,500 miles to Indianapolis for the start of the 10th National Eucharistic Congress.



On Pentecost Sunday, May 19th, the Blessed Sacrament arrives in Bridgeport, beginning a joyful and profound four-day encounter with the Holy Eucharist.

The Procession throughout the Diocese will encompass eight towns and 19 parishes before moving on to the Archdiocese of New York on Thursday, May 23rd. (The itinerary for time spent in our Diocese will be available soon.)

On June 1st at 11:00am in the new Fairfield University Arena Bishop Frank will preside at a Diocesan Mass of Thanksgiving. Each parish has been allotted 25 tickets to this liturgical event. Please contact the parish office if you are interested in attending.

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26

The disciples decided that someone should take the place of Judas, who killed himself in remorse for betraying Jesus. They nominated two who had been among them from the time of Jesus' baptism to the crucifixion. Then they drew lots to decide who would join them as witnesses of the resurrection.

Second Reading: 1 John 4:11-16

John reminds us that God dwells in those who love one another. We have come to know God's love for us. Only by loving one another can we be sure that God will remain with us always.

Gospel: John 17:11b-19

Jesus prays for his disciples at the Last Supper. He knows that by knowing the word of God as they do, they no longer belong to the world. He asks that God consecrate them in truth and protect them from the enemies they have made because of their belief in Jesus.
